FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

What is the financial commitment?

Pledge dues are approximately \$650 or less with different payment schedules available throughout the semester. Pledge dues are higher than those for actives because of the start-up fees involved, so if activated, dues will be lower in future active semesters. There is a scholarship fund available for girls in need, but it is only able to cover a portion of the cost. In addition, one of the requirements for membership in ADX is a commitment to live in the house for one year. Being a part of ADX is a financial commitment, and we expect girls to take the responsibility of being a good steward of their money. Please talk with our treasurer or president if you are concerned about the financial situation, because we don't want the dues to prevent you from joining ADX.

What is the dress code for meetings?

Dress code for MND and all official ceremonies requires girls to wear dresses or skirts with the following guidelines: no plunging necklines, shoulder straps should be 2 inches or thicker (sweaters can be used to cover up strapless or spaghetti-strap tops), and skirts must be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee. Nylons or tights must be worn with heels or flats. You will need a solid white dress and a solid black dress for certain ADX events, so make sure you have these handy (active members may have some for you to borrow).

What is the difference between ADX & Panhellenic sororities?

As an Associate Member of Panhellenic Council, we feel that we get the best of both worlds. We definitely experience the sisterhood you would expect from a sorority, having a common identity and a social group of like-minded women. Mentoring occurs through the Big/Little Sister relationships and there are plenty of fun social events. What makes us different is that Christ is our center. This means our number-one goal is to glorify Him with our relationships and actions, and we do this by being a support network to pray for one another, help each other with

our struggles, and participate in meaningful service activities to further His kingdom.

What events will I get to go to?

AΔX holds tons of events throughout the year! We love getting involved with other fraternities and sororities through social events and exchanges. Along with these, we hold one invite per semester (some past invites include murder mystery parties, Disneyland, and go-karting), two philanthropic events (although there's many more opportunities than just the two in which to get involved in that way!), and plenty of sisterhood bonding nights.

What are Coke Dates and why do I need to do two of them?

We ask that you go on two Coke Dates, which are one-on-one dates with an active of your choice anytime between Tuesday morning and Thursday evening, depending on your schedules and those of the actives. We feel that even though Rush is a fun social event, it doesn't always allow for deep, personal, spiritual conversations as much as an individual Coke Date does. You and the actives get a better chance to know each other, allowing for a much more personal and rewarding Rush experience. It also allows you the chance to get to know more about AΔX as an organization and ask any questions you might have.

What is a bid?

A bid is an invitation to pledge Alpha Delta Chi. Actives will decide which girls we would like to invite to be part of our Fall 2018 Alpha Beta class. A bid is an invitation—you are not obligated to pledge Alpha Delta Chi if you receive a bid, but we hope you will consider it. The bid means that we as a sorority feel you would be a great addition to our sisterhood, through upholding our standards and sharing in our values. However, if you do not receive a bid we are not obligated to explain the reasons you were not granted one, but we will do our best to discuss the situation with you.

HOW MUCH OF A TIME COMMITMENT IS ADX?

Every Monday night from 5:15 p.m. to about 8:30 p.m. (some meetings may be shorter, some longer) we have a mandatory dinner and meeting (MND). Our potential new members, or “pledges,” are required to show up to MND at 4:45 p.m. We also have various mandatory sisterhood events throughout the semester. Philanthropy events are also very important to us, whether it is through supporting other Greek houses in their philanthropies, planning and organizing our own big philanthropy event, or encouraging girls to join an on-campus or local volunteer organization. Pledges will have certain study hours that they will have to complete throughout the week, as well as various other pledge duties to complete with the rest of the pledge class. The largest time commitment is during the last week of pledgship, where there will be an event each day, but it will not conflict with the pledges’ academic schedules.
